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Course Description: In this course, we examine major developments and turning points in American history from the late nineteenth century to the present.

Classroom Expectations

Absences and Tardies: Assignments, powerpoints, and other class resources will be posted on Google Classroom and the class website. It is the student's responsibility to **check Google Classroom daily**. Missed assignments must be done on the student's own time. When a student is tardy, the main consequence is missing important information that is relevant to overall success in class. Chronic unexcused absences and tardies will greatly impact class participation score.

Extra Credit: Extra credit will always be offered to the entire class. It will often appear on tests/quizzes.

- **Journal:** The main extra credit for this class will be a journal/diary students will keep for the entirety of the school year. Journals are some of the best primary sources in the study of history. In order to get full credit, the journal must:
 - Have regular and consistent entries
 - Can be in any medium (Regular Journal, Running Google Doc, Google Slides, Video Entries, Blog, etc.)
 - Must be at least two paragraphs unless the entry is a song, poem or rap
 - Due May 27, 2022

These percentages are an estimate, actual percentages may vary. Grades are based on point accumulation and final grades are based on the number of points from the below categories:

- 50% Tests/Projects
- 25% Classwork/Homework

Late Work Policy

This policy applies to regular class attendance as well as absences that are legally classified as truant and unexcused. For excused and unexcused absences, this policy goes into effect when a student returns.

- **Full Credit** Class work must be started on the day that it is assigned; it needs to be turned in on the due date. Turning in an assignment after the due date will result in a reduction of points. If you need to turn in work late for any reason, please let me know.
- **No Credit-** Failure to turn in work will result in a zero. I cannot grade what I cannot see.

Weekly Surveys (10 pts.)

At the beginning of each week, a check in survey will be posted on Google Classroom. The purpose of this survey is to check in with each student and to review the lessons from the previous week.

Binder (10 pts.)

The binder will have four dedicated sections - Notes, Passed Back Assignments, Handouts, Projects.

Every other Monday we will have binder checks to make sure everyone is on the same page and to provide another opportunity for points towards participation.
